I AM the Light of the World Sarah Burtt March 26, 2017

Life Group Discussion Questions:

- 1. Thinking back on this week's sermon, is there something you recall that caught your attention or that you found challenging or confusing?
- John 7 relates that Jesus was in Jerusalem for a very special celebration: the Feast of Tabernacles (sometimes called the Feast of Booths). Read Exodus 13:17-22 (referred to in the Lenten Study Guide, page 26). Why was the Feast of Tabernacles a time of great rejoicing every year?
- 3. Read John 8:12-20. What are the followers of Jesus promised in verse 12?
- 4. Discuss these questions (Study Guide, page 23):
 - Why did the Pharisees question what Jesus said in **John 8:12**? Who was Jesus claiming to be?
 - How did Jesus respond to the Pharisees? What did He mean?
- 5. Read **Isaiah 9:2**. What "great light" was Isaiah prophesizing about? Who are the people living in "the land of the shadow of death?"
- 6. Read Isaiah 49:6 (see Study Guide, page 24). Then read Acts 13:46-48. How did the Apostle Paul apply Isaiah 49:6?
- 7. In John 9:6 Jesus again tells his disciples that he is the light of the world. When he is asked whose sin caused a man nearby to be blind from birth, Jesus spits on the ground, makes mud, then puts the mud on the man's eyes. What does verse 7 say the man did, and why is that important? After being questioned at length about how he regained his sight, what was this man's conclusion about Jesus, given in verses 32-33? How does this man's conclusion support Jesus' claim to be "the light of the world?"
- 8. The sermon pinpointed three truths about the Light:
 - 1. <u>Jesus (the Son of God) is the Light of the world</u>. Read **John 1:1-5**. What do these verses say about Jesus as the Word, life and light?
 - 2. <u>We need the Light</u>. Read **John 16:7-11**. How does the Spirit of Jesus apply the light of Jesus to our lives?
 - 3. <u>We (the children of God) are the Light of the world</u>. Read **Matthew 5:14-16** and **Ephesians 5:8**. Explain how followers of Jesus are children of light.

Next Step: Continue using the Lenten Study Guide to help you apply God's truth to your life.

Prayer: Continue asking Jesus to help you listen, follow and fully surrender to Him. Thank Jesus for being the light of your world.
