LEAD PASTOR LETTER

My family moved to Erie when I was 15. It was a tough move for me as I was just heading in to 9th grade at a brand-new school, having to make brand-new friends. It was probably the closest I've ever been to true depression. My family was invited to a place called Grace Church by Bob and Mel Deppen (I served alongside Bob as an Elder this past year). I was introduced to a solid group of fellow-teenagers, I was mentored, I was exposed to solid biblical teaching and vibrant worship, and the trajectory of my life was changed forever.

Such is the power of the local church.

I still pinch myself some days that I get to serve the church where I grew up. And God is still on the move today just like he was back then. Not just in my life – but now thousands of lives being impacted by the ministry of Grace. The main highlight of this year for me has been the launch of our new Transform 1:8 vision. The process of meeting with so many of you in the formation of that vision, and then many rounds of meetings to discuss supporting and funding this vision, has been incredibly rewarding. Together we raised almost \$2.5 million toward our \$2.3 million goal. Yep... you read that right! I was blown away by the generosity of our congregation. I can't wait to see what God does as we continue to chase Him with our whole hearts! Here are a few other highlights:

- Soul Care retreat in January.
- 21 days of prayer and fasting in February.
- Attendance, growth, and momentum at all our sites.
- Sermon series like: Fire Fall, ROOTED (Colossians), Stories (Parables), Ruth
- A record 4960 people in attendance at Christmas at the Warner
- Mobilization of hundreds of faithful volunteers serving in Grace Kids
- Record Easter attendance in Harborcreek (767) and Girard (247)
- Grace Youth expansion and collaboration with other churches through The Exchange
- "Church Changes" series collaboration with McLane Church and Take Me to Worship
- Formalizing our 3rd global partnership with Oono Church in Tokyo, Japan
- Construction progress on 7th and Holland building including \$100,000 grant from ECGRA
- 82 first-time salvations and 142 baptisms this past ministry year.

These are the things happening from a 30,000-foot view, but there are so many more significant things happening at the individual level; lives being changed through life groups, marriages being restored, relationships deepened, addictions healed. It's truly a privilege to have a front-row-seat for what God is doing. I'm looking forward to another amazing year.

2017-2018 SITE PASTOR UPDATES

Pastor Malcolm Beall – Grace Girard

Grace Girard recently completed its fourth year of ministry. God has brought us through a lot of growth over the past year, both as a church and as individuals. Girard's fourth year marked significant growth in Sunday morning attendance, as well as our various community events. It is exciting to see Grace's influence in the community grow as we become more involved and reach out when needs come up. Our strong and growing relationship with Girard School District also helps us reach the community. We are reminded that God is moving in great ways in West County. This growth reaffirms our calling to this area.

Life stories from people who attend Grace Girard continue to be the greatest reminder of why we are here. Like the couple last fall who experienced a personal tragedy involving their child. Someone from Grace Girard was led by the Holy Spirit to call this family and invite them to Fall Fest. The two families hadn't ever met, but lived through a similar traumatic experience with their child. This family came to Fall Fest with their children, and then to church the next day. Crystal and Dean have since begun a relationship with Christ, got baptized, taken CORE, and gotten in a Life Group. I also think of the three adult sisters who came to church five weeks ago because they were looking for a place to worship and feel welcome. I can't wait to see what God has in store for their journey. Praise God for the changed lives, and the many more to come!!

Pastor John Tiernan – Grace Harborcreek

It is hard for me to believe that I just finished my 5th year as Site Pastor at Grace Harborcreek. It has been an incredible journey watching God work powerfully through our volunteers and leaders to help so many people know and grow in Christ! This has been another year full of reasons to praise God: the addition of a successful third service, a significant increase in attendance, over 1000 people at our Fall Fest outreach, and needing overflow seating for our Saturday night Easter service. In the recent months, we are thanking God for providing two new part-time staff members, Kelly Lester (Engagement Lead) and Anna Bentley (Site Admin) who will equip and support our leaders and volunteers.

We are also celebrating the individual lives God is transforming. God is transforming Paula. She started attending last fall, joined a Life Group and is ON FIRE for Jesus! She shares her passion for Christ with her family, her friends, two youth who attend church with her, preschoolers in GraceKids, young people at the Exchange, and the staff and families at Edison Elementary. God is transforming Brian. He is trusting God through a difficult season, welcoming the support and encouragement of his Life Group, and walking in God's grace like never before. God is transforming a small group of 9th graders in GraceYouth. I've watched them rapidly grow in their faith, invite their friends to church, begin to serve on ministry teams, get baptized – and now some of their parents attend Grace because their kids kept inviting them. Those are just three stories out of the hundreds that are happening! With so much growth, it is thrilling to look ahead in anticipation of building a new worship center – and the people God will bring through those doors who will find new life and transformation in Christ!

Pastor Brian Lusky – Grace McKean

This ministry year marks the end of my time as the Site Lead for Grace McKean. As I look back, I am filled with extreme gratitude for the graciousness of God. It has been a joy of my life to humbly walk alongside our congregation here over some amazing moves of the Holy Spirit. Over the last four years, Grace McKean has grown by more than 350 people in average weekend attendance. Dozens of people have been baptized in the last year or have come to trust Christ as their savior. Weekend service offerings went from three to five and we're seeing growth both in the Worship Center and the Commons. Fall Fest, the Christmas Inviter, and Easter Egg hunt were highlights of the year. These events allowed a combined 1,400 people, many of whom have no church home or relationship with God, to experience unique community at Grace McKean. In addition, we hired two new staff, Scott Michel as the Grace McKean Site Lead and Stefanie Johnson as the Engagement Lead. Both are incredible leaders who will help people at Grace McKean grow in their faith.

In reflecting over the past year, I'm reminded of people who have taken significant steps in their spiritual walk. Alyssa is overcoming her previous addictions by committing her whole heart to Christ and recently celebrated her first year of sobriety. Kayla didn't have anywhere to go until a family from Grace took her in. After experiencing community at Grace McKean and the love of God through her new family, she gave her life to Christ for the first time this past spring. Tim and Sandy have just started their journey toward God. As an ex Catholic agnostic and a practicing Wiccan, they were not comfortable coming on Sunday. But getting a taste of community from our inviter events has convinced them that they can open up about their doubts about God and have taken the first steps towards a relationship with Him this year. Because people from Grace convinced them there might be a church community that was different from their past experiences.

I am confident that as I turn over this site to the capable hands of Scott Michel, God will lead us onward to accomplish more than we ever dreamed possible. I'm looking forward to cheering it on as the Global Missions Pastor and as a Grace McKean attender with my family.
